Summary of Progress	<p>The Partners and Community together (PACT) engagement process has been in place now for over two years. Officers ask the community to say what the main policing issues are for them and the top three set the focus for police resourcing for that area. Predominantly the issues are ASB, speeding traffic, anti social driving, litter and dog fouling.</p> <p>I am keen to develop this process on to make it more dynamic and meaningful. My staff are currently identifying PACT communities as the original surveying went across beat areas which may encompass several villages which have very different issues. A PACT community may be a hamlet or part of a town or may be virtual rather than geographic i.e young people or people who belong to a diverse group.</p> <p>From March officers across the Local Policing Area will be carrying out PACT meetings in more creative ways and will be as innovative as possible in finding ways to reach the whole communities. People will be invited to elect a PACT panel of people from their community who can agree the top priorities but also sign them off when dealt with so that more relevant priorities can emerge.</p> <p>We are also encouraging people to become involved in speed education and enforcement by setting up their own Speed Watch groups. A minimum of 7 people are required. They will be trained, equiped and supported to run speed sites in their area. Speeding cars receive a letter from the Constabulary and repeat offenders are issued with a Fixed Penalty Ticket.</p> <p>The Police and Local Authority share a target of achieving 84% of the community being confident with the way that Police and Local Authority are dealing with Crime and Anti Social Behaviour that matters in their area.</p>
