Members were invited to declare any interests in the items of business to be considered during the course of the meeting but none were made.

LSC.03/09 DETERMINATION OF AN APPLICATION FOR A NEW PREMISES LICENCE UNDER THE LICENSING ACT 2003: NORTON PARK, DARTMOUTH, TQ6 ONH

1. Licensing and Administration Manager's Report

The Licensing Officer presented the report and outlined the application before the Sub-Committee. It was noted that one representation had been received in relation to the original application. The operating schedules had been amended after mediation with interested parties and it had been agreed that a formal hearing would not be necessary.

2. Committee's Deliberations

The Sub-Committee asked the Officers if those who had originally objected to the operating schedule were now content with the proposed amendments. The Licensing and Administration Manager confirmed that this was the case.

During discussion, particular reference was made to:-

- a) the requirement for trained Security Industry Authority (SIA) door staff to be employed where necessary, as identified in the requested amendments (page 29 of the presented agenda refers). Following a query, it was noted that the need for door staff would be risk assessed by the Licensee;
- b) the request to serve late night refreshments daily, until 00.30 hours and until 01.00 hours on Saturday's and New Year's Eve;
- c) the Designated Premises Supervisor being Mr Robert Musker.

3. The Decision

The Chairman then announced the decision:

"We have considered the application to grant a new premises licence.

We have considered the Statement of Licensing Policy, the government guidance and our obligations that relate to the promotion of the four licensing objectives.

We note the amendments submitted and that all parties are in agreement that a hearing is not necessary.

It is our decision therefore to grant this application subject to the agreed amendments being incorporated into the operating schedule".
